Reader 1: There are many significant people in the story of Christ's birth, the shepherds the wise men, the innkeeper and Herod, but there were two in particular who stand out. Mary and Joseph, his earthly parents. Two people, a couple, not even married, chosen by God. It is these two people who are the final piece in God's incredible plan.

Reader 2: Luke's gospel says;- "In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said 'Greetings, you who are highly favoured! The Lord is with you.'
