Tom Kisitu writes from the manse office,

Marafiki zangu (Swahili for my friends), happy new year to you all. This is a heck of a year – not only because it has double digits, but because it is during this year that we will hopefully see numerous dazzling technological dreams turn into reality. These include:

- a high-speed rail that will connect Beijing to London
- cars that will fly or drive themselves
- Commercial trips to the moon and asteroids (and mining enterprises on them!)
- biofuels becoming cost-competitive with fossil fuels
- humans controlling devises via microchips implanted in their brains
- a synthetic brain that will function like the real deal

With big dreams like these in mind, I cannot help asking, what dream do we, as a church, have? What dreams we hope to see come to pass in 2020? We cannot afford to be left behind, while others make giant leaps forward. Can we? This is a good year, as one Christian optometrist suggests, for us to ask the Holy Spirit, in prayer, 'for fresh lens to see our church and community'. Just as 20/20 vision gives us the ability to see clearly, I pray that we will become even more focused on the mandate to "reach out, make disciples and teach God's people" in our parish and beyond (Matthew 28:19 – 20). I pray further that this year, we choose to devote more time and resources 'taking the message to people' than on the traditional church practice of 'bringing people to the message'. Thankfully, we are now reaching out to more people in our parish through our five emerging ministry teams namely, Faith Nurture, Community Outreach and Action Team (COAT), Finance/ Fundraising, Property and Church Administration. I pray that these ministries/teams will grow in strength and help us to realise to realise our future focus dreams like:

- developing our pastoral and worship ministries to meet the growing needs of our member and others, in our parish, who have expressed keen interest to join us,
- our **becoming** a more missional, visible and community-oriented local church,
- transitioning from a model to unitary constitution (a vital part of an ongoing re-think of our leadership/organisational structure),
- improving our visual and audio systems in the sanctuary and church halls,
- **developing** our ministry to children, youth and families and asking God, in prayer, to bless us with a **Children and Families Worker** to build on our good work in this ministry
- **equipping** our current and identified future elders/ leaders with skills and knowledge needed, among other things, to future-proof our church.

Furthermore, **it is my prayer** that, this year, we set-aside space, resources and time, for a second worship service, on Sunday, aimed at reaching mainly the young people, young adults and young families who, as a friend in a neighbouring church appropriately describes them, 'do not look like us, dress like us or talk like us'. Apostle Paul said he learned to be all things to all people in order to reach them with the gospel message (see 1 Cor. 9:19-23). There are many ways we have demonstrated our love for our community; many ways we have been 'all things to all people in our communities' (*I should add, many people in our parish continue to express their gratitude for the ways we have loved them, cared for them and come alongside them in their times of need*). **I pray** that we will continue to love, care, support and bless our parish in and through this second worship service.

Lastly, I pray that during this heck of a year, we all (as a congregation here at St Nicholas Church, Sighthill) see and understand more clearly God's plan for our local church and community. Part of this plan is mentioned in <u>2 Chronicles 20:20 (no pun intended!)</u>: "Believe in the Lord your God, and you shall be established; believe His prophets, and you shall prosper." The prophetic word, when it is accurate, gives us 20/20 vision. May this be our vision for 2020 and beyond. May God bless us all and make us a blessing for many. Amen.

ATTEMPTED ONLINE FRAUD

The following message has been received from Allan Simpson, Data Protection Officer for the Church of Scotland with the request that it be passed on to members of the congregation:

"Some congregations have reported attempted online fraud recently. These attempts use enough data to appear to be plausible requests for payment. The fraudsters are using names of Ministers, Treasurers and Session Clerks in their attempts to trick members into making payments.

There are many variations on the theme, so the nature of the fraud attack will change regularly. However, these particular attacks all make use of real names. So far (at time of writing) the vigilance of those involved has thwarted the attacks.

The fraudsters are relying on Congregation members and office bearers wanting to be helpful. Especially so at this time of year, when everyone is busy, and the holidays make it very difficult to seek advice.

My advice to Office Bearers, Congregations and Ministers is as follows:

- 1. If you receive a request or demand for anything involving money or personal data do not respond to it immediately. Stop and think.
- 2. **Question everything.** "Is this a normal request?", "Is it unusual?", "Would this person ask me a question like this?"
- 3. **Verify everything.** *Twice.* Make sure you verify using a different method of communication from the one used to send you the original message. For example, if you receive an email asking you to respond using a telephone number, email address or web link DO NOT USE IT. Instead, find information from a source you know you can trust and use that instead.
- 4. If you can't verify, DO NOT carry on satisfying the request or demand.
- 5. NEVER give your password for any online accounts you use to anyone. No competent and trustworthy service provider will ever ask you for your password.

I know some of this sounds obvious and simple stuff. However, this is the best way to keep fraudsters out. They are very clever; they know exactly how to prey on people and they can appear highly plausible. They are relying on people wanting to be helpful and they rely utterly on you not checking or verifying things before acceding to their request."
