

Bible Reading and brief Reflection Acts 2:42-47 The Fellowship of the Believers

Invitation and Prayer

Welcome to our communion service. We hope that as you participate in it, you have a real sense of the presence of God, as we remember His death and resurrection — in bread and in wine. As we come to this table, let's be quiet for a moment and prepare our hearts.



Moment of Silence

All: We are the people of God. We are the body of Christ. We are scattered, and the body of Christ is broken, but as we gather, the body of Christ is re-membered. Together we gather in obedience

to Jesus' command, to remember, and to share together in breaking bread and drinking wine, in remembrance of the death of Christ. Each piece of bread that we eat was once scattered across

These have now become for us the new wine of God's kingdom. In our communion with one another, we are fed with the bread of heaven that sustains us, and we drink the wine of gladness that brings us joy.
